# Summit catches the wave of health consumer power

If you are reading this edition of *Consumers Shaping Health*, you could still be reflecting on the varied and absorbing messages that came out of our *Shifting Gears* Summit. The multiple presentations and chats at the virtual event produced a thought-provoking array of topics as diverse as why it is time to re-imagine health and social care; 'big ideas' for change; global trends in safety and quality in health care; and future horizons in healthcare.

We have just finalised a <u>communique</u> to present the major themes of the <u>#ShiftingGearsSummit</u> and directions for future action it has inspired.

If there were an over-arching theme that captures the essence of the conference it was the enthusiasm and acknowledgement of the consumers' active role in the health care system — both in delivery and policy.

As the 820 delegates could have heard more than once, the consumer is often the only individual in the care setting to have insider experience and knowledge about all aspects of their care — a reality that the enlightened providers and organisations are accepting and building on.

Discussions covered issues from the rise of the patient as partner to the need for consumer organisations to be "engagement-capable".

The Summit gives stimulus for a more structured approach to the development of health consumer leaders, advocates and their organisations through the establishment of an **academy** to provide research, education, and training.

A bespoke **mentoring program** for consumer advocates and recognition with appropriate **remuneration**, and real empowerment of consumer representatives in decision powers are among other important ambitions voiced at the conference.

Leadership and education in collaborative practice and better ways to work together and share power through leading-edge programs such as CHF's **Collaborative Pairs Australia** is needed.

The Summit succeeded not only because of the interesting and vibrant ideas that it generated, but also more importantly because it reflected the mood for change and development of innovations that are needed and well within our reach.

Our Summit coincided with Close The Gap Day on 18 March. Its report, 'Leadership & Legacy Through Crises: Keeping our Mob Safe', produced by the Lowitja Institute, has a message that was also heard at the Summit, of respecting and engaging with communities' leadership and knowledge. The report's call for governments to recognise that communities have their own solutions has resonance for #ShiftingGearsSummit, writes Melissa Sweet, from Croakey, which provided such comprehensive coverage of the conference.

A project by the Older Women's Network NSW (OWN NSW) and Health Consumers NSW (HCNSW)

The HCNSW and the Older Women's Network (NSW) launched a new report on ageism in health care: "What Can You Expect at Your Age?!" – an investigation of recent experiences of age discrimination by older adults accessing health care at the CHF Summit: Shifting Gears.

The report is the result of an 18-month investigation into older people's experience of health care. Most people included were in NSW but we did hear from people across Australia and, sadly, that this reflects many people's experience of health care across the country.

HCNSW and OWN will be hosting a webinar at 10:30am on 23 April to further explore the issues raised in the report.

**Medicine Shortages Communication Champions** 



#### **Consultation Paper on medicine shortages**

Medicine shortages have been of particular concern during the COVID-19 pandemic, and for this reason the Department of Health has been reviewing the ways in which this can be managed.

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) is seeking feedback on proposals to help ensure ongoing, reliable supply of important medicines.

The Department of Health is seeking feedback on possible reforms that would:

- prioritise the evaluation and registration process for certain important generic prescription medicines, to reduce the risk of shortages
- encourage registration of more generic versions of medicines known to be affected by shortages, to mitigate the impact of those shortages
- support a more reliable supply of overseas-registered medicines imported into Australia

Public consultation is invited on the consultation paper: *Building a more robust medicine supply: proposals to help prevent, mitigate and manage medicine shortages.* 

Your input on the proposals to help facilitate ongoing, reliable supply of important medicines is welcomed. The consultation will close on 17 May 2021.

The <u>consultation paper gives further details</u> about proposed mechanisms to prevent and mitigate medicine shortages.

#### **COVID-19 vaccine rollout**

### Latest from the Dept of Health on the COVID-19 vaccine rollout in Australia

Currently people in phase 1a and 1b are eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine.

#### When will you get your COVID-19 vaccine?

Go to <u>Australia.gov.au</u> and use the <u>Vaccine Eligibility Checker</u> to confirm which phase of the rollout you are in.

**Top 3 COVID-19 vaccine questions** – phase 1b, misinformation and GP appointments. The latest video from Dr Lucas De Toca, First Assistant Secretary of the COVID-19 Primary Care Response, has answers to the top 3 questions you've been asking.

- Why are we starting phase 1B of the rollout when not everyone from Phase 1a has been vaccinated?
- How can I avoid misinformation about COVID-19?
- Can I address other health matters with my GP when I get my free COVID-19 vaccine?
